The research topic of actors can be considered a topical issue. The study direction aims to determine the Business Performance of Micro and Small-Scale Enterprises in Arba Minch Town, Southern Ethiopia. Some key ideas to discuss with the author:

- 1. The abstract needs to be shortened.
- 2. Keywords should not use words in the article's premise.
- 3. The citations in the article and reference list aren't suitable; for example, Muli Emmanuel Kyalo (2016), Juliana Anyango (2015), etc.
- 4. Some scientific articles were published over ten years ago, so they need to be reviewed and omitted.
- 5. In Table 3.2, the variable of Access to Finance (ATF) has a Cronbach's Alpha coefficient of 0.92, close to 1, and needs to be reviewed.
- 6. Hypothesis H1 does not mention the direction of impact of the independent variable on the dependent variable.
- 7. The index measuring women's business performance (dependent variable WBP) has not been mentioned.
- 8. Lack of discussion about research results, especially the results of testing research hypotheses.
- 9. The conclusion does not generalize what has been done from the research results.
- 10. Reference articles do not observe the regulation; review and remove articles that haven't citations in the article's content.
