The discussion section, while informative, could be improved with a more critical approach. This would mean a deeper dive into the interaction between the findings and the existing literature, pointing out contradictions and their implications for the field. Furthermore, elaborating on the practical implications of the findings would provide readers with actionable strategies or steps for ICT resource management in their own organizations.

The future research directions suggested in the thesis could serve as a roadmap for subsequent studies that build on the existing findings and explore unanswered questions. The inclusion of graphs or tables would effectively summarize the key points and make the data more digestible to appeal to a wider audience.
