

## Review of: "'Women come out for less important tasks': Understanding the reality of the gendered transport sector in Karachi through Key-Informant Interviews"

The article explores the perceptions of transport experts on the current state of transport and mobility barriers faced by women in Karachi, Pakistan. It highlights issues such as poorly coordinated planning, lack of effective governance and investment, and the presence of a patriarchal mindset among transport experts. The study emphasizes the need to challenge gender stereotypes in the transport sector and increase female representation. The article also discusses the lack of gender equality and representation in the transport sector, which contributes to a poor understanding of women's mobility barriers in urban areas in Pakistan. Overall, the article provides valuable insights into the challenges faced by women in accessing transport and offers recommendations for improving women's mobility.

## Comments for Improvement:

Suggestions could include measures to promote gender equality in employment, improvements in public transport infrastructure, and awareness campaigns on women's safety in transport.
