The review article "Magnesium and Longevity" by Patrick Chamber summarizes the multitude of potential Mg effects with special respect to aging and age-related diseases. There are many valuable hints and pieces of information combined with a comprehensive reference list to search for more details.

There are only minor suggestions to improve the manuscript.

- I strongly recommend including an abbreviation list, and please check whether all used abbreviations were explained.
- Since Mg uptake, analysis, and homeostasis are essential for functioning, chapter IX can be moved to be the first part.
- The information regarding COVID and long COVID is, however, interesting but does not need its own chapter.
- Meaningful chapter titles would be nice not just abbreviations. Perhaps the name of the component/parameter and the involved metabolic pathways or a link to a disease.
- Can the components discussed in chapter VII be summarized under an overarching title what is the link between them?
- The chapter related to vitamin D (II) seems to be too short considering the role of this vitamin and the complex figure related to this topic. A more comprehensive explanation would be appreciated. Details from the figure can be explained.
