The definition of some concepts should be added to the paper.

Insufficient Examples and Illustrations: The paper lacks concrete examples of the theoretical results. Without such examples, readers may struggle to grasp the practical implications or see how the results can be applied to specific problems in mathematics or related fields.

Comparative Analysis: There might be a lack of comparative analysis with existing work in the field. Without thorough comparisons and discussions on how the results build upon or differ from prior research, readers may find it challenging to understand the significance and novelty of the contributions made by the paper.

The conclusion paragraph should be added to the article.

All references mentioned in the introduction should be used within the work.
