- 3. Please review your topic and objectives. The topic is better when it is self-explanatory.
- 4. How can we argue the following: children 0–18 years old or adolescents 12–18 years old, and which will be inclusive, and why only up to 17 years old?
- 5. Why will authors start in 2000? And really, was ART started in a similar fashion throughout the world?
- 6. Background lines 2 and 3 need rewriting to be better understood by the reader.
- 7. Why use the word "several" studies but only cite two references?
- 8. Some word redundancy, for example, globally, key...
- 9. It is better to add supplementary files or an appendix like a screening tool form, a pilot study sample, a critical appraisal tool, and other necessities.
