Assessment and suggestions

The abstract should be specific in relation to the study carried out and not just in relation to the topic. It should be scientifically written, referring to the points included in the structure of the article (introduction, methodology, results and conclusion).

The introduction should present the topic with the latest information related to the object of study. You should consult the most recent bibliography and add any missing references.

The methodology should be clear, specifying the entire methodological process (population, context, sample (how it was obtained), data collection instruments and how the data was analyzed (statistics and tests carried out)).

The results should be presented with reference to the objectives of the study, highlighting the most important findings in terms of timeliness.

The discussion should respond to each objective, comparing the results with other similar and current studies.

The conclusion should summarize the purpose of the study.
