Greetings. I appreciate the efforts of the principal authors, co-authors, and their team for this study. However, there are a few observations that need to be addressed.

- 1. Background section is more like a discussion section. It can be modified by highlighting the magnitude of the problem, i.e., reduced infant sunlight exposure due to maternal myths or misconceptions. Global, national, and local statistics regarding the magnitude of the problem need to be incorporated in the background section.
- 2. Methodology should be concise. What is the significance of adding the latitude and altitude of an area where the study was carried out? Is it worth mentioning? If yes, then you need to justify.
- 3. Discussion part is well written.
- 4. Conclusion needs to be rephrased, e.g., since a low level of knowledge was found among the respondents.... After that, recommendations, health policy decisions, increasing awareness, and future directions need to be added in the conclusion and recommendation section.
- 5. References: Older references need to be replaced with the last 5 years' references of previous studies.
