Hi! I find the discussion very interesting and current. The text is well-written in terms of English grammer. I leave here below some observations and suggestions for the author to contemplate:

- I find the title not very indicative of the content of the paper. The essence of the paper is discussing the conceptualization of knowledge and how the different views can impact teaching practices. I would recommend rephrasing the title to be more indicative of the content.
- The text starts in medias res, I would recommend incluing an introductive paragraph about the context: why is this discussion important, how this discussion adds to the body of knowledge and why is it currently importat?
- I would also recommed separating the text with headers, it would improve readablity.
- I find the argumentation weak about the suggestions (what teachers and students should do) so I would recommend using references to better sustain the presented ideas.
