A rare, *monogenic* form of *diabetes* that occurs in the first 6 months of life. In about half of those with NDM, the condition is lifelong and is called *permanent neonatal diabetes mellitus (PNDM*). In the rest of those with NDM, the condition is transient and disappears during infancy but can reappear later in life; this type of NDM is called *transient neonatal diabetes mellitus (TNDM*).
