


Review of: "The Ancient Indian Knowledge System and the Medical Sciences"

This write up is a very short review of a very extensive subject matter. It is a revealing read for those with no prior knowledge of an elaborate and rational health care system in ancient India. That in itself gives the effort a purpose. Without checking the resources used, I find the language very good.

The two words "Ethnopharmacological Importance" at the beginning of the second sentence in the abstract are totally unconnected and do not seem to belong. The second part of the seventh sentence in the abstract "because ancient Indian medical sciences are considered superior to modern allopathic treatments" is not a claim that can be made at this point in time and should be removed.

Since this is a single author write up, the use of "we" towards the end of the abstract needs to be corrected.
