Planetary health should adopt a collaborative approach between INGOs, NGOs and government at national level to make tangible and sustainable changes. The determinants of roles and efforts of INGOs are resources (socio-cultural, and economic) and interest of NGOs and government (local, regional and national) where they operate and operationalize and it is highly contextual.

A little more comprehensive description on how this triangulation impact the outcome i.e to engage in Planetary health would provide a broader and in-depth picture of the issue. Before making suggestions on integrated planetary health programs for low- and middle-income countries, it would be a good idea to provide readers a glimpse of the way it operates in such countries as an example or the way it hasn't worked which then could be highlighted with the suggestions as done in the article.
