The article successfully articulates its main objectives, which are centred around the issue of benefit distribution and stability in the DES. It is clear what the authors aim to achieve.

The methodologies employed in the paper appear to be well-thought-out, although further justification could strengthen the paper. For instance, the choice of specific analytical methods could be better elucidated.

While the article does delve into data analysis, some of the methods and their relevance to the research questions could be clarified further. Additional empirical evidence would also enhance the paper's credibility.

The conclusions appear to be logically derived from the analysis. However, the discussion on the broader implications of the research is somewhat limited and could be elaborated.

The paper does contribute new perspectives to the discourse on DES and value co-creation. However, it could benefit from distinguishing its contributions more explicitly from existing research.

The article is generally well-written and structured, though some areas could benefit from further editing for clarity and coherence.

Recommendation

The paper is good, but could benefit from some revisions to enhance its rigor, clarity, and depth. I recommend the paper for publication subject to minor revisions. Specifically, the authors should focus on:

- 1. Providing further justification for the chosen methodologies.
- 2. Making the link between the literature review and the research questions more explicit.
- 3. Clarifying the data analysis methods and potentially adding more empirical evidence.
- 4. Elaborating on the broader implications of their findings.
