This is a rare case, a good case report. I support the author's view: PET/CT imaging of skin tumors may not be very effective if the PET/CT diagnosis is negative. The PET/CT imaging of CE may not be evident, especially in the early stages or when metastatic nodules are small. Therefore, CE may be undetected in PET scans because PET scans rely on glucose metabolism. Dermatologists may be more accurate in diagnosing CE. I strongly agree with the author's views on MDT. At present, our hospital has routinely carried out MDT for malignant tumors and some difficult non-tumor cases. With the continuous improvement of the clinical diagnosis level, CE has been gradually recognized by more clinicians, reducing the rate of misdiagnosis and missed diagnosis.

In addition, I also suggest some additions and modifications to the manuscript.
