Cross table peer-support

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noun. A collaborative learning approach in which students are permitted to cross between table groups during team-based educational activities to provide support to peers who are struggling. This often involves the movement of key resources, such as students with specific skills or knowledge, physical materials, or shared ideas, to facilitate problem-solving and ensure equitable progress across all groups.
