

Review of: "[Case Report] High Bifurcation and Anatomical Variation of the Brachial Artery"

This paper reports a case of a high bifurcation of the brachial artery into the radial and ulnar arteries at the middle third of the arm in a 65-year-old male cadaver. The paper also provides a brief overview of the embryological development and clinical implications of this variation.

However, the paper does not provide any statistical analysis or comparison with other studies on the prevalence and distribution of this variation. It would be useful to cite some relevant literature and discuss how this case fits into the existing knowledge and data on brachial artery variations.

I suggest that the authors revise their paper by addressing these issues and providing more information and references.
