Review of: "Treatment of Facial Ageing with Ozone Therapy: Clinical Case Report"

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General Comment:

The manuscript is generally well-written. Ozone therapy has a wide range of applications in medicine, but since this is a case report, it is not necessary to discuss all of them. I find the abstract, case presentation, and therapy protocol to be appropriately presented.

1. Discussion Section:

I believe it would be beneficial to add the following paragraph at the end of the discussion section:

"Currently, there is no established ozone therapy protocol for the treatment of facial aging. We found that when the frequency of ozone application, total number of sessions, and duration of treatment were set as in this case, the therapy was effective. It is highly likely that varying the dosage, intervals, and number of total sessions could yield even more positive results. We believe that larger clinical series will help determine the optimal therapy protocol."

2. Conclusion Section:

In the conclusion, it would be better to use softer language instead of definitive statements. For instance, you could say, "Ozone therapy could be an effective alternative therapy."

Based on these points, I would suggest a minor revision.
