Regarding the gap in the topic, the variables least investigated in the literature are social media use, preferred music genre, and sports participation. Further exploration in the introduction and discussion could enrich the study.

The methodology seems rigorous to me, as does the sample size calculation.

Regarding the gender perspective, the study considers sex, not gender. I think this is a limitation that should be made clear because to talk about gender, we must investigate a person's gender identity and not just assume it's equivalent to sex. As this is something that was not done initially, this must be made explicit in the limitations.
