The authors detailed a lot the examples of other countries but when the audience started to read about the digital systemin the US, the topic become general. Explanation and elaboration about the importance of unified systems in particular medical record, and how it helps across different levels in the healthcare systems was missing. The importance of the digital link between primary and secondary and tertiary healthcare system was not obvious: no detailing of the advantages or the limitations, no explanation about the patient digital privacy and respect of confidentiality and how patient can choose how many information he allowed for each healthcare provider were detailed. The link between health disparities and the importance of digitalization during time of crisis and catastrophes was not approached. In general, a more robust article is needed.
