Additionally, paragraph 3.1 lacks sufficient references, reducing the credibility and reliability of the information presented. In addition, there is a lack of consistent citation of references throughout the text.

Impact and Novelty: While the paper sets the stage for potentially impactful research, it falls short in providing substantial data, case studies, or specific findings. The information presented in the paper relies solely on existing literature, resulting in a lack of new information and originality. As a result, the paper's novelty and contribution to the field are limited.

Weaknesses: One major weakness of the paper is its general nature, as it lacks quantitative data and fails to delve into specific details. The conclusions drawn from the research are overly simplistic, lacking depth and comprehensive analysis. The absence of quantitative data and detailed case studies weakens the overall robustness of the paper.

Suggestions for Improvement:

- Enhance the conceptual framework by clearly outlining its significance and relevance to the research.
- Provide some quantitative data specific to Zimbabwe, since, as the authors state, there is a lack of literature on agritourism in the country. This would contribute to the originality and relevance of the research.
- Ensure coherence and consistency throughout the paper, addressing the issues identified in paragraph 3 and incorporating appropriate references.
- Include empirical evidence, such as case studies or field research, to strengthen the paper's impact and provide concrete findings.
- Develop more nuanced and in-depth conclusions, supported by quantitative data and comprehensive analysis.

In conclusion, while the paper presents an interesting topic and potential impact, it lacks a strong methodological foundation, quantitative data, and comprehensive findings. The limited novelty and simplistic conclusions diminish the overall contribution of the paper. By addressing the mentioned weaknesses and incorporating the suggested improvements, the paper can significantly enhance its quality and validity.
