- 1. Perhaps there was a reason for the majority of participants to be nurses, but it is not stated.
- 2. Was there inclusion/exclusion criteria for participants?
- 3. The stated results are not reflective of the numerical infographics. We are also unaware of which departments the participants work in. A surgical nurse may have a different level of knowledge of nutrition than a cardiac nurses.
- 4. How was it determined to include dentists and physiotherapists.
- 5. Are dietitians credentialed or licensed in this area of Nigeria? How can we account for physiotherapists having more knowledge than a dietitian in Nutrition?
- 6. Is there a scope of practice defined by each of the types of participants.
- 7. Perhaps starting with 1 disease state that you find most significantly impacted by nutrition education or lack thereof.
- 8. And with the data, what do we do now? Perhaps awareness of resources? I think the in service idea is wonderful, but requires creation of materials and someone's time. Are there online resources you could direct readers to?
- 9. I'm not certain of how marital status is relevant
