

## Review of: "What substances are adolescents vaping? Estimating nicotine-specific and marijuana-specific vaping from US national youth surveys"

- 1. At the fifth line in Introduction section, please add "use" to "adolescent e-cigarette".
- 2. At the line 4 from the bottom at page 2, "thus simultaneously overestimating nicotine vaping and underestimating marijuana vaping" may not be true. The question was used to track e-cigarette use instead of marijuana vaping. In addition, at NYTS, there were several questions which did separately tracked marijuana vaping.
- 3. At sample section at page 3, "MTF is an annual survey on tobacco use and tobacco-related indicators collected from a nationally representative survey of middle and high school students (grades 6-12) in all 50 US states." Is it NYTS instead of MTF?
- 4. The study sample for MTF included all participants. Why did the study restrict the study sample to current e-cigarette user only from NYTS? Table 2 reported "Proportion of past 30-day vapers who report that their vaping products contained any nicotine and/or any marijuana, National Youth Tobacco Survey 2021". It didn't make sense. If the study sample was limited to current e-cigarette user only from NYTS, how to get "Marijuana use was reported by 45.7% (MTF) and 42.5% (NYTS) of past-30-day vapers"? So, it should be reported by current e-cigarette users only.
- 5. At measure section, former and current smokers were defined but not never smoker for MTF data.
- 6. At table 1, Gray cells: N<50; may be unreliable. The estimates among these cells should be compressed.
- 7. The study imitation didn't mention MTF data collection stopped prematurely in 2020 and its impact on findings. In addition, data of MTY 2020 was the results before COVID-19 pandemic while those with NYTS 2021 was in the pandemic. So, was comparison between MTF 2020 and NYTS 2021 feasible?
