However, the manuscript has many pitfalls that increase concerns toward its publication in its current form.

Comments in the article that need clarification, rewrites, and/or additional information:

- Covid-19: Should be all letters capital (COVID-19) all through the text
- Very short introduction and background; the author should explore further previous studies on the topic and compare them with other similar research.
- Methods: Where is the study period, study settings, details of the study design? Data on study participants, such as the
 process of selection and recruitment of the sample, their inclusion criteria, sample size, and sampling techniques, and
 methods of data collection. Results shouldn't be written in methods (for example, "The majority (99%) of teachers have
 less than 10 years of experience," which means the majority of teachers were young and experienced
 Al/ChatGPT/Chatbot technology in teaching and learning environments).
- Where are the ethical considerations?
- Where are the results? Sociodemographic data, awareness, barriers, relationship between artificial intelligence tools and their aspects in higher education,etc.
- Many grammar and spelling errors that need clear revision and correction

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
