Introduction - it would be useful to include statistical data that constitute specific arguments for the topic under investigation;

The title of the article is Attitude towards business activity risk: evidence using logit models for two groups of OECD countries, but in the research the author did not highlight this aspect. In this context, it would be good if the author would go into this aspect in more detail.

Objectives of this study - the objective of the research is a bit vague so it would be better to rephrase it in a more specific way;

Method - selected method is appropriate for the proposed objective, but it would be good if the author would argue why he selected this method for this research.

Source data - It would be good if the author could explain why he conducted the research for the period 2001-2016, when the factors influencing the decision to start a business were clearer and more stable, compared to the situation in 2019 - 2023. Or at least to present a small composite analysis of the factors in the period analyzed and the most recent one to see the extent to which they have not changed much. Or the author should include a small composite analysis of the factors in the period analyzed and the most recent one, to see to what extent they have not changed much.

Results - when analyzing the results and in particular the differences obtained in the evaluations (for ex: group of Latin American countries and OECD countries), it would be good if the author could provide some more specific explanations of them.

Conclusion: Probably this sentence needs to be finalized (In many countries, there is no government strategy, at almost all levels of government, that encourages its population to undertake what???). At the same time we can't agree with the affirmation that the countries don't have the Government strategy in this direction... Perhaps these strategies are not adapted to the social and economic situations in the countries concerned? Here the author needs to present more specific arguments...

As a conclusion, I recommend this article for publication taking in consideration my suggestions.

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
