

Review of: "Beyond culture shock: entering the complex world of Global South expatriates' adaptation"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

The article's topic is relevant and promising as there is little research focusing on Global South expatriates and their cross-cultural adaptation. However, the manuscript would benefit from:

- 1) Aligning its title, objectives and theoretical content.
- *As is, there is a weak link between the different sections.
- *The title does not quite reflect its content.
- *Key concepts have not been clearly defined.
- *Line of argument is broad. It could be made stronger by including a key argument in each paragraph.
- *Stronger synthesis capacity would help.
- *It is a bit vague in what field this article aims to impact. Is it in the business? Human Resources? Cross-cultural adaptation?
- 2) Even as a conceptual paper, it needs a methodology section.
- 3)Prominent authors in the field of cross-cultural adaptation have not been included. E.g. Oberg (1960), Adler (1975), Furham and Bochner (1982).
- 4) To improve its relevance, literature from the last 5 years needs to be contemplated.
- 5) Research questions would regularly emerge from the review of literature review. As such, they need to be relocated and need to demonstrate how they emerged.
