- 1. Abstract is well written, but please provide explanations on methodological approach and impacts of the research.
- 2. The authors provide a clear on this issue, however, it is better to also include the case study or example of climate protest in East Asia in the introduction.
- 3. The authors provide very clear explanations for theoretical framework, however, I suggest that the authors should make a clear logical connection between the theory and this study.
- 4. The selection of research methodology is suitable to achieve the objective, however, details explanations on samples are required.
- 5. The article presents data that supplements the knowledge and rich findings on climate protests from a less studied region.
