

Review of: "Reflections on Bordering, Micropolitics and Everyday Life in Peacebuilding Processes: Revisiting the Lingering Legacy of the 1949 Armistice Agreements"

From a historical point of view, the article, "Reflections on Bordering, Micropolitics and Everyday Life in Peacebuilding Processes: Revisiting the Lingering Legacy of the 1949 Armistice Agreements" is of good quality but the article has two serious problems:

- (1) it lacks a systematic methodological structure that informs the reader what the research problem is, what the methodology is and what the contribution of the article's findings is.
- (2) Secondly, for an article that purports to review "Everyday Life in Peacebuilding Processes", this part dedicated to "peacebuilding processes" is very poor and limited (see the last section of the article before the conclusions). I suggest that authors develop this part in greater depth (bringing more experience and historical data to this part of the article). I suggest further revisions to this article.
