First of all, I noticed a few problems relating to grammar throughout the article. Second, there are a few points to be addressed, as follows:

Abstract: There is a "policy" missing between "(...) Kenya's foreign (...)" and "(...) was formulated (...)".

History of Kenya's Foreign Policy: Citation needed when writing about the criticism of the Estrada Doctrine.

Brief History of Daniel Toroitich arap Moi: Citations needed in the third paragraph, where you state that Kenya was one of the most prosperous African nations during the cold war, where you state that Moi's regime faced economic stagnation, and where you state that the west no longer deals with Kenya as a strategic regional stronghold. There are a few missing commas in this section as well.

Conceptual Framework: Citation needed for "Recognition is thought to be fundamental in international law. Through recognition, international rights, and obligations shall or shall not be put against new states or governments" and for "Once an international actor (State) has been accepted internationally, it becomes very difficult for other international actors to change the status from recognition to non-recognition because of overthrow or any other change of government. The State remained an international legal person".
