This manuscript is very interesting as it addresses "Young love in contemporary China: Attitudes and behaviors in romantic relationships" which analyzes choices, establishing relationships. Here are some observations:

- 1. The abstract is extensive, it could be more summarized, it lacked objectivity.
- 2. In the introduction, there is an unnecessary story about dating in China, I recommend that you enter the main objective of the study. From this paragraph the text is more interesting: To the best of our knowledge, the attitude and behavior of Chinese youths when initiating dating and relationships is an area that.... Still, it is not clear the statement: "It appears that China is following the general global, or at least regional, trend in the commodification of sex". The introduction needs to be more concise, it is long with a historical context that is not necessary. I recommend more objectivity and attention only to the object of study. The study presents five research questions, could narrow and focus on attitudes, preference and time in relation to dating.
- 3. The method is well outlined
- 4. Results: It suggests organizing the results to consolidate in a few tables, mainly the profile information.
- 5. The discussion needs greater articulation with the central theoretical bases on choices, attitudes.
