

Review of: "Examining Water Use and Sanitation Practices in Rural Schools of Chegutu District, Mashonaland West Province, Zimbabwe"

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Author declares that no specific funding was received for this work. Also Author declares no potential competing interests to declare. Based on this rhetoric, I evaluate this work as an attempt to help the African regions rather than to demonstrate the art of research for scientific colleagues. In this regard, I congratulate the author for the fact that he independently investigated a very important issue for schoolchildren, pupil and for ordinary residents of the region in order to help find answers from the point of view of both science and the public interest. The author has successfully researched the interviews and questionnaire and reflects them in figures and graphs. Isn't this a research methodology? Yes, I agree with my colleagues that in some situations the work is a little unnecessarily long, but on the other hand, the author wants the reader's attention to the fact that he knows research methods and, with financial support, can expand his research capabilities. This work, firstly, lets us know about the problems of the African region, mainly what is happening in schools, and secondly, it gives us the opportunity to think about solving these problems. The author tries to evaluate the new technologies that are used in sanitation and hygiene in developing countries. In this regard, the author also hints at the African business environment, what to produce, how to produce and for whom to produce. That is, the topic may seem small, but its content covers a large audience in the fall.

I do not strictly judge the author for the fact that he/she refers to old data in some cases, firstly, he/she does not refer to old statistical data, but to concepts and references and to those topics that have not yet been resolved in Africa since then. On the contrary, I liked that the author mostly used primary data as interviews with schoolchildren.

Everything that is posted on the graphs is a fairly clear study. I believe that the study is necessary and is devoted to a very important topic such as water, sanitation and hygiene, and the author identified the main problems in schools and tried to make recommendations for solving them. In the future, the author may not prolong the topic, but instead focus on the main topic and continue his research from a thematic point of view.
