Structure of the Abstract: Follow the IMRaD structure (commonly used in scientific papers): Introduction: Briefly state the problem or issue. Methods: Describe the research design and data collection methods. Results: Summarize the major findings. Discussion: Highlight the conclusions drawn from the results.
- 3. Why do you think that this manuscript is scientifically robust and technically sound? No, because it appears that the abstract does not effectively communicate the study's purpose, methodology, results, and recommendations. In addition, the introduction of the manuscript lacks key elements such as clearly outlining the purpose, methodology, motivation, and key highlights. The literature review heavily relies on existing literature and may not fully address the research gaps. Furthermore, the methodology section does not include important tests, such as model-building methods, etc.
