

Review of: "Semiosphere and Anthropological Aggression on the Example of the "Memorial Conflict" — Polish-Russian borderland: Warmia"

The article submitted for review concerns a very current and important problem for the inhabitants of the Warmia and Mazury region. This region has a common border with the Kaliningrad Oblast of the Russian Federation and, until the war in Ukraine, it carried out many activities and projects together with its cross-border neighbor (including those financed by the European Union).

The analysis of the research material focuses on the "memorial conflict" currently taking place in the Polish-Russian border region of Warmia. The remarks made by the author in the field of anthropological aggression are very accurate and are confirmed in practice. The conclusions are proof of the author's proficiency and research competence. As a resident of the Warmia region, I confirm that many inhabitants of the region perceive the destruction of signs of local culture as an act of violence, and the apparent lack of semiotic links between national and local culture leads to social stratification.
