

Review of: "Perceptions and Attitudes about COVID-19 Vaccines Regarding Vaccine Intention and Hesitancy of Attendants of a Healthcare Center in Northern Cyprus"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

The study addresses a good topic but might be a bit outdated. First of all, I think the paper requires proofreading and some rephrasing. Here are few comments which could help strengthen the study:

Background:

- I think the study would benefit from an overview of the situation in the country (when was it started, availability, regulations, is the vaccine compulsory)
- Some statements lack reference (for example, the lack of knowledge about vaccines in LMIC is not based on any reference).

Methods

- The rationale behind convenience sampling isn't convincing.
- More information on the questionnaire, its validity and reliability, could be helpful.

Results

- I found some linkages missing in the results section (for example, is there a link between source of information and hesitancy?)
- It could be worth investigating the relatively high rate of population who didn't complete their primary vaccination series (10% got one dose while only one vaccine is a single dose).
