At the same time, it looks like this could possible be developed into a good literature review, but make sure that the papers that you're referring to are about language learning or closely related subjects; they are really wide-ranging. What level of students is this about? University or below? Online teaching or in-person? Provide a background for the paper and a problem statement. It isn't a thorough examination and integration of community service into language instruction to promote social change, as is - keep going!

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
