

Review of: "Three Unique Virtues of Approval Voting"

This work deals with a comprehensive analysis of Approval Voting (AV) and its superiority over other voting systems. Three virtues of AV are outlined and argued. The results show that AV emerges as a strong option for realizing democratic will.

First of all, I would like to congratulate the author on this peculiar research. The manuscript is quite interesting and has some value.

I would just like to make a few observations and suggestions for the authors to contemplate:

- 1. Inserting endnotes can perhaps be a bit chaotic as the references are all positioned at the end. Perhaps it would have been more effective to insert them as footnotes.
- 2. The references are a bit few. In my opinion, there should be at least thirty.
- 3. It is not very clear what the contribution of the paper is.
- 4. In the end, perhaps it can be useful to include a short paragraph in which limitations and future developments are provided.
- 5. The last comment concerns the use of the first person throughout the manuscript; perhaps it would be better to make the entire text impersonal.

Finally, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on this research, and I think addressing the above-mentioned aspects can strengthen this investigation.
