I like the way how the author presented and discussed the cases of the various countries and contexts and his own contribution related to the issue of refugees with each of these communities. I have no further comments at this stage except for one extra note that is adding a few more, perhaps two or three, references related primarily and directly to disaster management in order to relate this topic to the larger field of disaster and emergency management.
