Secondly, the author extensively cites questionnaire feedback, but its objectivity and representativeness are insufficient.

Does the author's questionnaire involve enterprises of all industries, different enterprise sizes, and different ownership structures? In addition, the individual characteristics of entrepreneurs can also affect their sense of security.

Thirdly, the author can argue based on some authoritative papers studying the relationship between government and market.
