

Review of: "[Case Report] Occlusive Syndrome by Internal Transmesosigmoid Hernia: A Case Report and Review of the Literature"

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The authors present an interesting case of a potentially devastating complication from a rare condition. I appreciate the attempts at taking the salient case points and making recommendations for management. Areas to improve the paper are to avoid less common abbreviations such as "RAS" and all of the metrics measured in "biology." These appear to be uncommon in other papers and may lead to confusion. Additionally, I am still unclear about what a cholidochon is.

Perhaps there should be a written description because it is an uncommon term. In the diagrams, please remove the patient's name from the CT images (this is considered a violation of patient privacy in the United States). Lastly, labeling of the intraoperative photos will help identify the mesosigmoid hernia clinically for readers who may not visualize this rare condition well.
