I noticed that a lot of your references about sexuality is too old and outdated. I recommend that more recent references be used, preferably nothing below 2010. I find this particular concept of sexuality, outdated and conventional "with reproduction: it is through sexual relations (except in special cases) that a man and a woman can have a child."

I hope the authors would be progressive enough to discuss that at present human sexuality is considered to be a "spectrum" by discussing the concept of SOGIE (sexual orientation, gender identity, expression). This newer and progressive concept of human sexuality is backed-up by psychological science. Although Freud's theory is historically significant and ground-breaking during his time, there are more modern theories that are evidence-based.

In the data analysis, did the authors execute "reflexivity"? If yes, then discuss how it was executed, if not, why was it not executed.

Based on the results, I would recommend that part of the recommendations is for parents to be psycho-educated on the newer concept of human sexuality. Sexual Literacy is important and more so, a more progressive and recent evidence-based concept and literature about sexuality must be taught to both parents and children.
