This manuscript provides a comprehensive review on the social dilemma, and key factors contributing to the 'tragedy of the commons' in water resrouces management. Dominated by the natura-sciences focused and engineering-based approaches in water management, this is a timely and much needed research in highlighting the need for not only formal government regulations, but also the informal social institutions such as social value orientations, incentives, knowlegde and education in contributing to sustainable water management.
