

Review of: "Reversible transliteration of the historical Ukrainian alphabets in the context of heritage preservation and linguistic technologies development"

In this article, the authors try to analyze the alphabet used for the Ukrainian language during its evolution over time to propose a system of their simple-corresponding transliteration (bijection) in the Latin script which has the property of reversibility and obeys the Ukrainian Transliteration Standard and gives compatibility between languages already transcribed.

The authors have done a high level of work, well structured, well written, easy to assimilate, and requires great encouragement from us. Nevertheless, some remarks can be raised and corrected:

- See if the Ukrainian dialect is uniform across the country.
- Different Ukrainian dialects.
- Give the register of the former Ukraine.
- In the last section, the authors could have used tables to clarify the TRANSLITERATION, and its reciprocal table.
