- 3. Usually, in the science of statistics, either there is a relationship or there is not. What do you mean by possible association?
- 4. The keywords should match the MeSH.

Introduction

1. Although the introduction goes well at the beginning when it comes to spirituality, it fails to express the challenges and what is known based on the current literature in this field. There is a need to be a little broader about spiritual needs. How do spiritual needs affect the quality of life according to the current literature?

Method

- Are people under the age of 18 working in this profession that the researchers excluded from the study??!
- 2. The exclusion criteria must be different from the inclusion criteria!
- 3. The time and place of the study are not well defined.
- 4. How did you determine the sample size?
- 5. What was the method used for sampling? Has the census method been used?

Result

- 1. Usually, in the results, we report the findings of our study. Why have researchers made references in the results section?
- 2. On what basis is it mentioned in the findings that the majority of the participants had moderate to good quality of life? Classification of quality of life, as well as other tools, is not provided in the method section.
- 3. Too many tables. Regression results should be reported in one table, not 3 tables.
