

Review of: "Particular Sexual and Ambitious Attitude threatens the Global Societal Functioning and Individual Wellbeing"

The authors' main idea appears to be that the cultural practice of patriarchy, combined with authoritarian governments, reduces people's ability to have a reasonable life, where basic needs are met as well as the opportunity for thriving.

They propose a practical solution: educating humanity about what is a decent life. I could not determine whether the authors' educational ideas include helping people change the government, change other aspects of their lives.

One question: the United Nations has put forward declarations about universal human rights. One powerful statement is the rights of children. I ask the authors: how does your educational plan overlap with UN decrees?

Additional educational plans exist. One that I suggest is every child growing up in a privileged way (i.e., having basic needs met and opportunities in place to thrive) should be able to befriend a child, via computer, who is living a less advantaged life. Exposure to a privileged peer is a form education. All tools can be used for translation; the children can share aspects of each other's language.
