This is a very interesting post about the general knowledge on Neurodevelopmental disorders.

However, if you agree, some suggestion would to be pursue:

- Based on The Manuscript topics, if you agree, title should be reworded as "how neurodevelopmental disorders may affect neuropsychological profiles?"
- Consider adding the epigenetic as an interaction between gene and environmental factors Who Can interact yet early in pregnancy life.
- You write.." The **classification** on which several authors agree involves: **a) specific childhood neurodevelopmental disorders** (those classified according to DSM-V as ADHD, communication disorders, ASD, etc.). I suggest to cite all The neurodevelopment disorders, so: Intellectual disability and Motor disorders(tics and Tourette);
- You write: .." d) childhood neurodevelopmental disorders due to environmental alterations (e.g., fetal alcohol syndrome, valproic acid embryopathy), Down syndrome, Williams syndrome, Angelman syndrome); **d) childhood neurodevelopmental disorders due to environmental disturbances** (e.g. foetal alcohol syndrome, valproic acid embryopathy)." This sound as a repetitive sentences (point d) Can be explained by one of The two option, better the second, labelled as disturbances;
- foetal or fetal? Both correct, but I suggest to use Just one Form in The same text;
- " ...and some of the **executive functions** such as planning are also abnormal." If you want you Can correct include working memory in the executive functioning;
- Explain that neuropsychological profiles in NEURODEVELOPEMENTAL disorders Can be not homogeneous, but they have "high" and "down" profiles (which are different between for exemple ADHD and ASD). " ;
- What do you mean for "neuropsychological waiting" "testing" or other? Ad well as The "delay aversion"?
- Please, cite Dsm V as DSM 5 And Maye cite The last revision TR And ICD or WHO definition as well;
- Consider citing the refs at The end of The document into The text.
