

Review of: "Theory of infrastructure: Impact of egoism manifestation by a therapist towards a patient in psychotherapy"

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This article addresses a little-discussed and relevant topic in psychotherapy, the therapist egoism. Although the topic is quite interesting and original, the article has some critical issues that should be reviewed before publication.

First, when publishing a research article, whether it is a qualitative or quantitative study, it is important to include recent references, maximum of the last 10-15 years.

Also, it is appropriate to include references when making a claim (see, for example, "This paper addresses this gap. Notably, its framework is based on several fundamental ethical principles, the most important of which emphasizes that the therapist's role is to always provide the patient with a safe place.").

The concept "egoism satisfaction infrastructure" should be better explained and argued more because it is unclear to the reader who is not familiar with this topic.

It is also unclear to the reader in the introduction section what theoretical background the author is referring to.

In addition, the structure of the article has some problems: the section on methodology and results is too long and somewhat confusing. Most of the information in this section should be moved to the introduction. Only the steps of the study and how it was done should be included in the methodology section
