Dear authors,

First I'd like to recommend that you think about the term soccer. If the focus is the USA and Latin America is ok, but in Europe and other world areas, the most used term is football. There is American Football and Football (soccer).

At Methodology / Instrument you wrote that "For those who say they do not attend, the question is how much they trust members of clubs and organizations they attend". I didn't check the cited source of inspiration to these questions, but later in the results I didn't find any presentation for such data. If you don't intend to share such results or compare it with the ones of who attend the matches, maybe you don't need to mention it.

At the results I do recommend you try to reach a different layout to present and describe the data. It was not so easy for me to follow the presented data and explanation. In the final version using graphs maybe could help.

My main recommendation is to try to make the article more reproducible, that is an academic trend. Maybe you could share your database and or codes to generate the tables or graphs. I also recommend you share the period you have collected the data that can be important to future studies. Football fans are very sensitive to the moment of their clubs in terms of sports results what could generate different answers depends on it, from time to time.
