Thank you for submitting your work. I congratulate all of you for managing the cases smoothly and efficiently. Kindly go through my comments and do make changes as suggested.

In clinical case no.1, what do you mean by correlogram here?

The authors have mentioned: continuous insufflation of sleep- this statement is not scientifically correct.

Mention the doses of the drugs used for premedication.

The authors have mentioned in the first case: administration of sodium thiopental 400 mg; At 9:07, the infusion of propofol at a rate of 600 mg/h (5.2 mg/kg/h), and dexmedetomidine 100 μ g/h (0.9 μ g/kg/h) was started. This sounds contradictory. Both thiopental and propofol are never used at the same time, especially in a spontaneously breathing patient.

The abbreviation defined is NFC but later mentioned as NFK.

The authors have mentioned: The surgeon administered local anesthesia at 9:22. Please mention which local anesthesia and what dose/volume.

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
