

Review of: "The Impact of Tax Revenue on Macroeconomic Variables: A Case Study from Palestine"

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Potential competing interests: There are no potential competing interests to declare.

1. The article lacks rigor. Several statements are made without citations.
2. The use of macroeconomic variables as a dependent variable in the topic is not valid. There are several macroeconomic variables, and which one are they referring to? They may use the term "selected macroeconomic variables." Besides, it may be proper to use economic growth or a single macroeconomic variable as a dependent variable.
3. The theoretical framework is weak. It should provide a clear theoretical model that can help in the empirical identification.
4. The literature section is not well reviewed; there are no clear gaps identified.
5. The authors did not provide justification for the statistical tests they have conducted.
6. The results of the unit root test, cointegration, and causality are not shown. They have shown only conclusions. I would love to see the empirical results for validation.
7. Table 6. Fully Modified Least Squares Model is confusing. No clear distinction between explanatory variables and the dependent variable(s), making interpretation of results improbable.
8. The paper is weak for publication in its current form.
