Thank you for inviting me to review this interesting paper. I firmly believe that progress in the field of AI will only be made if we stop focusing on the extremes of 'AI will save us' or 'AI will doom us.' Papers of this nature that seek to find a balance are essential to progressing the conversation in this way. To further improve the paper, I would add the concept of augmented intelligence - this is by far the most common phrase in industries where AI is being pushed most heavily (for example healthcare) and I suspect would result in you finding more examples of 'collaborations.' I also think it would be an improvement if more discussion was included about the barriers/enablers to collaborations or - if no information on these topics is forthcoming from the literature - then a brief discussion of why this might be and what the future research implications are. Overall an interesting paper based on an interesting concept and I shall be intrigued to see how it develops.
