For the section 'Although Germany has officially apologised to both Namibia and Tanzania for the atrocities committed while these countries were German colonies (and have now remunerated Namibia), the British Government have failed to apologise for the genocide they caused in Kenya, despite recently acknowledging it occurred.' I would suggest rather writing it as follows so that it actually relates to the rest of the paragraph: 'Despite acknowledging the atrocities perpetrated in Africa, the British government has been intransigent in not apologising (as Germany did). An attitude like this may indicate reluctance to engage in decolonisation efforts in the health sector.'

For the section on EDIJ, i think we are not doing justice to the topic and it merits a paper on its own as it is a complex issue. So I would suggest taking it out of this paper, and doing another paper just on that and on the work being done in that respect globally and then more particularly in your setting.
